I recognize that my sins have kept me separated from You, and that without Your forgiveness, I will remain separated from You for eternity. I am truly sorry for my sins. I believe that You sent Jesus Christ to die in my place for my sins. I believe that on the third day Jesus Christ rose from the dead, having paid my penalty in full, and was completely victorious over sin and death. I surrender my heart, my will, my emotions, my entire life to the Lordship of Jesus Christ. On the basis of the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, I ask You to forgive my sins. I receive Jesus Christ into my heart to be the Lord of my life. I thank You that you have heard my prayer. I thank You that through Jesus Christ I am now a child of God. I thank You that through Jesus Christ I am now a child of God. I thank You that through Jesus Christ I now have eternal life. Heavenly Father, I pray this in the name of Jesus Christ MY LORD! AMEN.

<u>NOTE</u>: The above is more of a doctrinal statement than a sample prayer to be used when leading someone to Christ. It outlines what is contained in the true act of repentance and confession.

Have I Answered the Call of Baptism?

I. THE CHRISTIAN LIFE IS CELEBRATED WITH BAPTISM:

- A. The Word "Baptism" As Used In Both The Old & New Testaments.
 - Old Testament: The word "Baptism" is not found in Hebrew text but the concept of "ceremonial washings" is found frequently both in the Scriptures and in the Jewish customs of Jesus' day. These washings signified purification and consecration.
 - a. Exodus 29:4, 40:12
 - b. Leviticus 14:8
 - 2. New Testament: "Baptizo" literally to dip, immerse, or submerge. This word was used among the Greeks to signify the dyeing of a garment.
 - a. Luke 11:38
 - b. Mark 7:1-4
- B. John's Baptism:
 - 1. John's baptism was a "preparatory washing" for the coming of the Lord Mark 1:3.
 - 2. The KEY to John's Baptism was REPENTANCE for the remission of sins.
 - a. Mark 1:4-5
 - b. Luke 3:3, 7-8:
 - c. "Then all the land of Judea, and those from Jerusalem, went out to him and were all baptized by him in the Jordan River, confessing their sins." Mark 1:5 (NKJV)

C. Christian Baptism:

- 1. Christian Baptism was instituted by Jesus and replaced the "Baptism of John".
 - a. John's baptism was only temporary: John 3:26-30
 - b. Christian baptism is the fulfillment of John's baptism: Acts 19:1-7
 - c. Jesus made Christian Baptism a Universal Command: Matthew 28:18-20




THE CROSS: LORD & SAVIOR!

FOURSQUARE CHURCH LIFE

➤ Is Foursquare A <u>DENOMINATION?</u>

- **Denominate**: To give a name to, gather under a name.
- <u>Foursquare</u>: Those who have gathered under the name and symbols of the <u>Cross</u>, the <u>Dove</u>, the <u>Cup</u>, and the <u>Crown!</u>
- <u>Movement</u>: This term defines our family more than the term "organization".

> Foursquare **DISTINCTIVES**:

- Established December 28, 1927 as the *International Church of the Foursquare Gospel* to <u>facilitate the establishment of new</u> congregations.
- Today there are over **8 million members** in over **140 countries**,
- Church governing style is called "modified Episcopal".
 - ✓ This means that ministry is by appointment.
 - ✓ Pastors and leaders are appointed by Foursquare leadership rather than being placed into ministry thru a congregational vote.

Foursquare <u>MEMBERSHIP</u>:

- Officers and <u>Directors</u> of the corporation.
- Ordained and licensed <u>ministers</u> holding current credentials.
- Individual members of local congregations in good standing.

> Foursquare <u>STRUCTURE</u>:

- <u>Denomination</u>: Led by a President, Board of Directors, Cabinet, and Executive Council.
- <u>Districts</u>: Led by a District Supervisor.
- Churches: Led by a Pastor (and elders) along with a Church Council.
- Governing Body: The highest level of authority in the Foursquare Church is the Convention Body (existing of all of the previous).
 Only the Convention Body can make or amend the bylaws.

FOURSQUARE CHURCH LIFE

> Foursquare LOCAL Church Life:

- <u>Districts</u>: Foursquare churches in the U.S. are divided regionally into what are known as districts. Each district has a team devoted to strengthening and multiplying Foursquare churches in their respective local communities.
- <u>Church Property</u>: Church properties are held in the name of the Foursquare organization. This means that local congregations are simply <u>stewards</u> of the property.
- <u>Finances</u>: <u>Annual Congregational Meetings</u> are held each January where the entire church membership receives a full printed report and has a collective role in approving the next year's budget.

Church Council:


- ✓ Must be <u>church members</u> in good standing. They are composed of <u>recommended</u> candidates from the existing Council that are <u>affirmed</u> by the members of the congregation at our Annual Meeting.
- ✓ The Church Council assists the pastor in the administration of the physical resources of the local church ministry. Biblically they would be identified as Deacons (Acts 6).

• Ministry Staff:

- ✓ Ministry staff is appointed by the Senior Pastor.
- ✓ All licensed ministers must seek credentials with the <u>District</u> and be approved by the <u>Foursquare Board</u>.
- ✓ Foursquare and The Fellowship at Weatherford welcome and recognize women as equals in the role of ministry and leadership. Women can pursue all areas of ministry and licensing equally with men.

<u>Note</u>: The Foursquare Church is an active participant in the National Association of Evangelicals, the American Bible Society, the Pentecostal/Charismatic Church of North America, the Pentecostal World Conference, and the Evangelical Fellowship of Missions Agencies. Many of its' leaders, pastors, and members serve on the executive boards and committees of parachurch agencies and endeavors. The Foursquare Church is interdenominational in both creed and practice.




